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Message From Mr Jones

Dear all,

I would like to thank you all for your tremendous support this term. As you know, the parental response to the Ofsted inspection survey was enormous, and overwhelmingly positive. It will come as no surprise to you that I was extremely proud of the way the children presented themselves during the inspection. I told the lead inspector during the initial phone call that our children were amazing, and they certainly proved that over the two days. I hope it won't be too much longer before we can share the final report with you all.

I would like to inform you about a personal issue. I was diagnosed with cancer last year and will be shortly undergoing major surgery to address the condition, and will then be off work for several weeks as part of my recovery. As you can appreciate, school staff wouldn't normally share such personal information with you all. However, my illness coincides with the school going through a period of change with the proposed academy conversion taking place. I am grateful that the Ofsted inspection has occurred before I take some time away, so I could help show the inspectors the fantastic work of the staff and children. I am telling you about my planned absence so you know that I am not here for any other reason than medical necessity.

I have utter faith and confidence in the senior team to lead the school successfully through this period. Like me, they are proud to serve this school community and I know they will approach this unwanted episode with care and commitment to the children, as they always constantly do. Please contact Mrs Dowlman or Mr Donaldson if you have any issues that you would normally raise with me.

I am already looking forward to coming back and seeing everybody after my treatment and recovery.

Sadly I am writing to advise that Mr Neale one of your School Crossing Patrols has decided to hang up his Lollipop and will be leaving his role as the School Crossing Patrol for your school. We'd like to thank him for all his hard work and commitment to keeping your school community safe as they cross back and forth en route to and from school. He will be sadly missed.

However, that will leave the crossing unsupported until such time as we are able to recruit someone to take on the role.

Are you looking for part-time work. It is a paid position and you are paid for ten hours per week term time. The hourly rate is £10.98 and the hours are annualised as they are for other school roles. Full training and uniform will be provided.

You will need to be a good communicator with an ability and understanding of working with the general public.

We are looking for someone to provide the crossing Monday to Friday an hour in the morning and an hour in the afternoon at school run times (your duty times will be agreed with the School and it may be that you are not on duty for the whole hour, however, you will be paid for the full hour each shift – 10 hours in total per week). If you can't commit to 5 days perhaps you could share the job, maybe a friend could cover the morning shifts and you the afternoons, or perhaps you could do Monday, Tuesday Wednesday and then a friend take over on Thursday and Friday. We are open to discuss with you how the vacancy might be managed.

Please if you know anyone who may be interested in taking on the role, perhaps a neighbour or family member who is looking for part-time work, pass on the information to them. The role is funded by the Road Safety Team at Bristol City Council.
